# SHADE TREE COMMISSION NEWS

## *Pruning Trees in Winter and Early Spring*

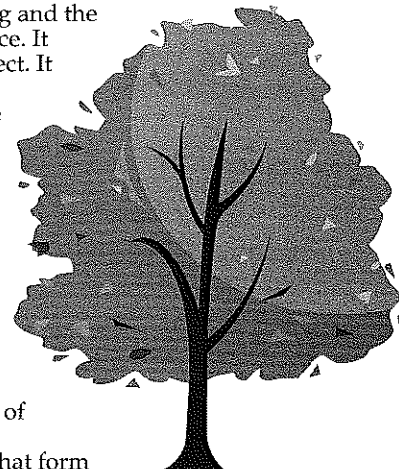
The timing of tree pruning depends on individual species and your goals for the tree. Light pruning and the removal of dead wood can be done anytime. Pruning during dormancy is the most common practice. It results in a vigorous burst of new growth in the spring and should be used if that is the desired effect. It is usually best to wait until the coldest part of winter has passed. Some species, such as maple, walnuts and birches, may "bleed"—when the sap begins to flow. This is not harmful and will cease when the tree leaves out.

Keep in mind, if your purpose is to enhance flowering, pruning should be timed as follows:

1. For trees that bloom in spring, prune when their flowers fade.
2. Trees and shrubs that flower in mid- to late summer should be pruned in winter or early spring.

### Keys To Good Pruning:

1. Begin visual inspection at the top of the tree and work downward.
2. Use The 1/3 and 1/4 Rules of Pruning
  - a. Do not remove more than 1/4 of a tree's crown in a season.
  - b. Ideally, main side branches should be at least 1/3 smaller than the diameter of the trunk.
  - c. For most deciduous (broadleaf) trees, don't prune up from the bottom any more than 1/3 of the tree's total height.
  - d. Where possible, try to encourage side branches that form angles that are 1/3 off vertical that form "10 o'clock" or "2 o'clock" angles with the trunk.
3. For most species, the tree should have a single trunk. Identify the best leader and lateral branches before you begin pruning and remove defective parts before pruning for form.
4. Do not paint pruning cuts.
5. Keep tools sharp. One-hand pruning shears with curved blades work best on young trees.
6. For high branches use a pole pruner. A major job on a big tree should be done by a professional arborist.
7. For larger branches, cut outside the branch bark and ridge collar (swollen area). Do not leave a protruding stub. If the limb is too small to have formed a collar cut close.
8. When simply shortening a small branch, make the cut at a lateral bud or another lateral branch. Favor a bud that will produce a branch that will grow in desired direction (usually outward). The cut should be sharp and clean and made at a slight angle about inch beyond the bud.



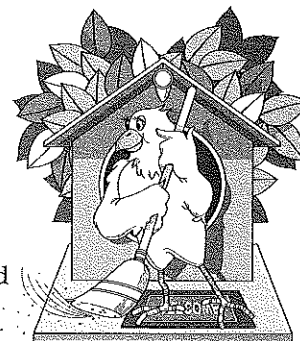
## 2011 SPRING CLEAN UP

- Wheels, metal pipe and barrels may be dropped off at salvage yards such as Beacon Scrap Metal in Freehold and Blewett Inc. in Howell.
- Propane tanks may be traded in at Home Depot, Lowes or Ace as long as they are equipped to fill tanks. Outdated tanks, prior to 1999 with valves removed may also be taken to Beacon Scrap Metal in Freehold and Blewett Inc. in Howell.
- Hazardous materials, paint etc. may be taken to the County Reclamation Center in Tinton Falls by appointment. For more information call 732-922-2234

# Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze)

## 2010

### Eligibility Requirements

You must meet ALL of the following requirements:

- You were age 65 or older as of December 31, 2009, or if under age 65, you were receiving Federal Social Security disability benefits as of December 31, 2009, and December 31, 2010;  
*and*
- You have lived in New Jersey continuously since before January 1, 2000, as either a homeowner or a renter;  
*and*
- You have owned and lived in your home (or have leased a site in a mobile home park for a manufactured or mobile home that you own) since before January 1, 2007;  
*and*
- You paid the full amount of the 2009 property taxes due on your home by June 1, 2010, and paid the 2010 property taxes by June 1, 2011;  
*and*
- Your total annual income was \$80,000 or less (combined income if married or in a civil union) for both 2009 and 2010. **NOTE:** With very few exceptions, **ALL INCOME** received during the year must be taken into account to determine eligibility (including social security, pension income, etc.).

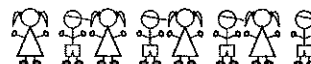

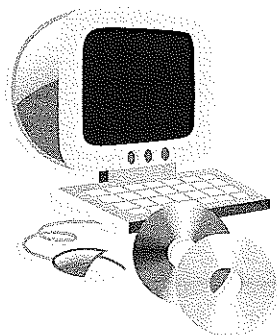

CPR, It Saves Lives. You have most likely heard this in the past, whether in the news, a TV show or from friends. Research shows that heart attack victims have almost double the chance of survival if they are given CPR immediately after a heart attack.

When a person goes into severe cardiac arrest, lungs, heart and brain are deprived of oxygen. CPR, in the form of rhythmic chest compressions, can add vital minutes while awaiting the arrival of Emergency Medical Technicians or other emergency personnel who can assist with defibrillation and oxygen.

Quoted from the Los Angeles Fire Department training manual: "It is important to remember that when indicated: Good CPR is better than bad CPR, but even bad CPR is a million times better than no CPR at all".

The Millstone Township First Aid Squad can train you to perform CPR effectively. We encourage our neighbors to contact us and find out more. Help us help the community.
